So to get to the hot topic - ATV's and golf carts. Our by-laws state ATV's are not allowed on our roads. By and large we have been lenient in enforcing this rule. This has led to risky behaviour with children under the age of sixteen without a license operating these vehicles on the roadways in the residential areas. Several concerned residents have contacted the RCMP and they are now aware of this problem. We encourage parents that allow their children to drive ATV's to take them to the trails behind the fuel tank, away from the residential areas to lower the risk of personal injury to themselves or others. If complaints continue and the RCMP begin enforcing the Alberta Traffic Safety Act, then any person (under-age or adults with a drivers license) would be ticketed if driving on the roads in the resort. Bottom line- stop letting your children drive ATV's and golf carts in the residential areas to prevent more frequent visits from the RCMP and reduce the risk of injury to everyone.
