Dear Community Liaison Officer:

We are writing to request a meeting between EDF EN Canada Developments Inc. ("EDF"), and owners and members of the Board of the Little Bow Resort Condominium Corporation 931 1680, which occupies the N4 and portion of the NE 5-15-21-W4M and is approximately 700m outside the consultation area of the Blackspring Ridge Wind Farm (the "Project"). The Board has concerns with the Project and would like the opportunity to meet with EDF. The primary concern relates to safety because of the recent lack of/or poor cellular reception many of the owners have noticed. The Little Bow Resort in general has, in the past had sporadic cell coverage; however certain areas of the resort had good coverage. In addition, some owners spent hundreds of dollars each to purchase cell signal boosters and were able to get a good signal within their residences. Since the Project has been constructed, the areas which used to receive cell coverage, now do not and some of those owners with boosters claim they receive little or no signal. As not being able to use a cell phone is a very big safety concern, you can understand the owners worry with the sudden lack of or poor cell service. As there are studies available detailing how similar projects might impact cell, TV and internet service, we would like to meet with EDF to better understand the details of your Project and discuss the above mentioned studies and EDF's understanding of them.

We also understand EDF established the Blackspring Ridge Liaison Committee to address concerns during the development, construction and operation phases of the Project. There are several organizations including the Town of Vulcan and the Village of Carmangay who have members on this committee. Although the Project is now in its operation phase, the Little Bow Resort would also like to discuss with EDF the possibility of a seat on this Liaison Committee given that the Resort has more residences (approximately 180) and is closer to the Project boundaries than the Village of Carmangay. Although the Little Bow Resort was not consulted during the Project application or construction phase, we feel it advantageous to both EDF and the Little Bow Resort to collaborate on a go forward basis.

We thank you in advance for your prompt attention to our letter and look forward to collaboratively working together with EDF to address our concerns. Please contact the undersigned at 403-329-3777, to set up a meeting at your earliest convenience.
